Her husband went home with the Lord in 1998. She remembers how the Lord saved her from a life of alcoholism. She testifies: she became very tired of alcoholism and being out on the streets of Gallup, NM. One day she looked up into the skies and prayed, "Lord, if you are very real and

Bro. and Sister Gardner taught her Bible stories. She learned the hymns in both English and Navajo. She loves to sing for Jesus. For 37 years, Sister Lee worked with the Gardners to provide songs at funerals, family gatherings and church services. Sister Lee also prayed that the Lord would provide a home for her and her family. In 1991 a home was built for her through the Southwest Indian Foundation. It was a joyous occasion when family and friends gathered together in her new home and Bro. Gardner held a dedication service to the Lord! Her mother also became a Christian through her testimony. Grandma went home to heaven in 1985. Sister Lee has many fond memories of Bro and Sister Gardner. Bro. Gardner would usually bring his friends from back east to come and visit her home. Once they all went to a funeral service for a 95-year-old grandma. They were not ready for the muddy roads and spend the whole day driving from the funeral. There were six people who shared a few slices of bread and a can of Spam. She said it was like Jesus feeding the five thousand on a few fishes and loaves of bread. Her children attended the Free Trinity Christian School. Her prayers are to see each of her

children and grandchildren live for Jesus Christ. She knows that no matter what difficulties we face, our Heavenly Father..."is able also to save them to the uttermost that come unto God" ... and ... "is able to keep you from falling, and to present you faultless before the presence of his glory with exceeding joy". Gazing out into the horizon from her porch, she said Bro. and Sister Gardner were wonderful people. She is very happy to have known them. Their dedication and service to the Lord left a deep impression on her life. One of these glorious day she aims to enter the gates of heaven and what a reunion it will be for her!!
